Courageously reimagine our way of educating new generations according to the commitments that the Pope proposes in the Global Compact on Education:

- Listen to young people and their cries of indignation for a better world and accompany them in the common effort to transform this world.
- Form people who are capable of putting themselves at the service of the community and society.
- Find other ways of understanding the economy, politics and progress from the perspective of an integral ecology.
- Educate others and ourselves to be welcoming, opening ourselves up to the weakest, most vulnerable and marginalized.
- Ratify our commitment to the Teresian Educational Proposal
