

Introduction

This document is meant to be an itinerary for walking together during this Chapter year, both personally, as a community, and as a group. The materials that we present to you have a double purpose: first, to deepen the call to walk a path of openness and conversion towards A NEW AWARENESS OF OUR COMMUNITY IDENTITY; second, to elaborate contributions for the Provincial and General Chapters.

The document is divided into two main sections. The first: "Widen the space of your tent", consists of two parts (1A and 1B), which will bring us closer to different perspectives and experiences so we can look at reality, our contexts, and the Society based on criteria that will broaden our awareness of our community identity. The second, which also has two parts (2A and 2B) "How many loaves do you have... they all ate and were satisfied", offers us guidelines for community discernment and the elaboration of our contributions.

In each part, we can find various themes or content with different proposals for activities: community meetings, personal or group readings, videos, workshops, community prayers, retreats which allow for different rhythms and preferences in the use of the materials.

In order to realize this journey of reflection and experience on the Chapter theme, it is very important that each province **organize** the **way of using the materials so as to assure the** broad, rich, and varied **participation** that we desire. Although the majority of the materials are oriented to personal and community work, they can easily be adapted for use in larger, intercommunity groups, in provincial or regional assemblies, in formation meetings for educators and meetings with lay people from our apostolic works and provinces or in groups of the Teresian family, TAM, FundEO and other Teresian entities.

In addition to the diverse ways of using the materials, we offer **options to go deeper**, **according to three different objectives**. Throughout the document we will indicate the steps of the itinerary according to each of the options. Below, we briefly explain the objectives of each option:

→ **Option for the elaboration of contributions**¹: This option allows us to go through the journey by getting in touch with some basic themes in order to open ourselves to a new awareness of our community identity and offers guidelines for a community discernment that ends with the elaboration of contributions.

The planned duration is about 3 months, so that the communities or reflection groups will be able to hold the meetings and present the contributions in the time established in each province.

The topics for the basic itinerary are:

- Spirituality for a community identity
- Vulnerability as an opportunity to meet with others.
- Listening to the older sisters of the Society
- Synodal and intercultural leadership experiences
- → Option for further deepening: once the contributions have been sent, the materials offered in the document will help us to continue deepening in the chapter theme, choosing other themes from section 1A and 1B that have not been used before and selecting some activities from each theme.
- → Option to work in groups on specific topics of interest, either to go deeper or to send contributions: the breadth of topics and resources can make it easier for each province to continue working on the Chapter theme and to go deeper into aspects that may be of special interest to some sisters or lay people, according to the areas in which they carry out their educational mission or the contexts in which they find themselves.

The specific topics offered for further study are:

- Teresian spirituality and community identity of Henry de Ossó,
- Global citizenship and transformative educational experiences,
- Contributions of indigenous peoples and the Ubuntu philosophy,
- The world of young people
- The search for an economy and a politics at the service of the common good
- A look at community awareness from the point of view of immigration and women.

Each community or group can carry out all the proposed activities, accessing the articles and videos offered within each topic.

¹ We understand by **CONTRIBUTIONS**, everything that enriches, makes explicit or deepens the meaning and content of the Chapter theme, and offers lines of action to implement it in our Teresian life and in the different areas of mission.

We understand by **PROPOSALS**, specific actions, alternative projects or initiatives that require modification of the Constitutions or involve significant changes in the life of the Society that cannot be approved by the Provincial or General government.

1. In each topic you will find a **GUIDE** with the necessary indications for the personal work and the development of the community or group meeting. In the guide you will find the theme of the meeting, the objectives of the activity, the materials needed for the personal and group work and the guidelines to carry it out. 

- 2. In addition to the guides you will find **TWO WORKSHEETS** personal and communal to take note of what resonates with you and which will help us to discern further:
 - a. Personal Listening Sheet: This is to personally collect what resonates with us, our concerns, and invitations we feel. It will help us to follow the thread of what the Spirit is awakening in each one and prepare us for the discernment for the elaboration of contributions at the end of the process. We invite you to write down, after each theme, what you have felt about what you have read, seen and shared, and what moves you.

1. WIDEN THE SPACE OF YOUR TENT



" Widen the space of your tent, spread out your tent cloths unsparingly; lengthen your ropes and make firm your pegs. For you shall spread abroad to the right and left."

Is 54:2-3

This section is an invitation to open ourselves to different perspectives that can help us to accept a new way of looking at reality, based on the call to *follow a path of openness and conversion towards a new awareness of our community identity.*

It offers us reflections and questions to "lengthen our tent ropes", to go beyond our limits and let the Spirit move us beyond the known.

In this part we will work from two approaches: an openness to different aspects or perspectives that illuminate the theme of community identity to which the Church and our world invite us - section 1A-; and a look at different experiences, projects, and signs of life that are being lived in the Society, through sisters and concrete educational projects - section 1B-.

1A. Openness to different perspectives in view of community identity.

The **two basic themes** of this section for the option of elaborating contributions are spirituality and vulnerability. For this reason, we encourage all the communities to dedicate two sessions to work on them, following the indications of the guides and appendixes that are in the materials.

To complete **the option for the elaboration of contributions**, we also suggest that a third theme be chosen according to the preferences of the community or group. In other words, the work proposal for all the communities is as follows:

- Theme 1: Spirituality.
- Theme 2: Vulnerability.
- Another theme from section 1A to be chosen by the group/community.
- → **Option for further deepening:** as we mentioned in the introduction, once the contributions have been sent to the Provincial Chapter, we encourage you to continue to approach other perspectives that enlighten us for the journey of openness and conversion towards a new awareness of our community identity. For this purpose, the materials of the themes not previously worked on are available.
- → Option to work in groups on specific topics of interest, either to go deeper or to send contributions: some of the topics can be selected to work on with specific groups of the province according to their interests or formation needs: educators of

our apostolic works, personnel, groups of catechists, groups of the Teresian family, networks or groups by areas of mission in the provinces, meetings with parish or diocesan groups, etc.

1. BORN FOR COMMUNION? Spirituality for a community identity.



Aware that true spirituality is that which leads us to recognize and live our relational identity, we begin this journey by approaching our own experience of spirituality and approaching various authors who speak to us about the spirituality of connection, Trinitarian spirituality, community spirituality and the good way of life.

A personal reading and a community meeting are proposed. The guide offers alternatives for personal work and the development of the meeting, taking into account the different community realities.

4. LEARNING WISDOM. Indigenous peoples and ubuntu.



"We are with others." (We only know ourselves in relationship with others.) "I am because we are". These expressions reflect the experience of a community identity, which is essential in the cosmovision of the indigenous peoples and the

Ubuntu culture. For this reason, they are included in this reflection document for the chapter theme. With the activities in this section we will have the opportunity to go beyond our contexts and paradigms and open ourselves to the richness that these cultures offer us. It can be a beautiful experience for our communities in the three continents, making the leap from our own contexts to what some of our sisters in the Society live in other places.

The first proposal for a **community meeting will** lead us to get to know some elements of the cosmovision of the indigenous peoples with respect to life in common.

The second proposal is also a **community meeting**, in which we will approach the five pillars of the Ubuntu method that develops five basic competencies for personal growth: self-knowledge, self-confidence, resilience, empathy, and service.

5. WALKING TOGETHER. Synodality.



Aware that each community has worked on the theme of SYNODALITY in different spaces, we propose that we **revisit the path taken up to now** and invite us to "Walk together" from a change of mind and heart that leads us to look again and to change our structures, ways and forms to facilitate the experience of synodality.

The proposal consists of **two workshops** that can be done in community or with groups of people with whom we share the mission.

The first workshop invites us to look at the attitudes that dispose us to live in the light of synodality and asks us to look at section II.6 of the Memoir of Gratitude (Memoria Agradecida) elaborated by the General Government—Government at the service of Teresian religious life on the way to synodality.

The second workshop called *Church and Synodality* brings us closer to section I.2 of the Memoria Agradecida, on the ecclesial context. It is designed for a community meeting.

6. SONS AND DAUGHTERS OF THE SAME WORLD. Global Citizenship

In the second we will approach the term global citizenship and we will learn about the process that is being developed in the Society and in the different Teresian educational projects working on the Global Education Pact. In the third, a workshop for educators, we will reflect on how to help create habits of behavior of global citizens. And finally, in the fourth proposal, we will deepen in the paradigm of "Caregiving" ("Cuidadania"), a paradigm for social transformation through care and interdependence.

7. DOES EVERYTHING BELONG TO EVERYONE? An economy at the service of the common good.



The social and ecological crisis we are living through reminds us every day that we need other ways of approaching and living an economy that better takes into account people and the planet, promoting the common good over particular interests.

In this section we offer three proposals to present alternative economic paradigms to those that predominate today.

The first proposal presents some lines of action proposed by Pope Francis to achieve an economy at the service of life. The Pope proposes a way of managing the economy that puts

the person at the center, cares for the environment, and promotes development that is more human in character. We are offered several texts for **personal reading and community dialogue**.

In the second proposal, a critical analysis of current economic organizations and some options for an economy of the common good is encouraged. A video on this topic and a group discussion are proposed.

The third proposal brings us closer to **concrete examples of** companies and projects that are already applying new criteria and methodologies for a more circular, social, and supportive economy that is committed to the common good. As far as possible, it would be good to carry out this activity and **personally get to know some of these initiatives** in our closest contexts.

1B. To approach different experiences and processes in the Society, Teresian projects, Teresian family.

In this second section of the document we intend to make known different **experiences and processes that are generating a sense of community identity in the Society and, in general, in the Teresian family**. We hope that drawing near to the life of the Teresian sisters and these groups will encourage our hope as we become aware of how we are collaborating in the transformation of reality in different contexts.

The content of this section 1B is organized into six aspects of the life of the Society and of the Teresian Family. In each of them we present testimonies of sisters, lay people, communities and schools who share what they are living, what their experience brings to the journey of conversion towards a new awareness of our community identity, and the

challenges and concerns that present themselves for the Society and the Teresian Family at this time.

First of all, we offer the testimony of several of our **older sisters**, some **coordinators of communities of our older sisters or infirmaries** and of **several lay people** who are related to them. This reality of the Society can also help us to broaden our personal, community and provincial horizons, showing us the richness of the experience of common care in the midst of the vulnerability of old age and illness.

In addition, through other **testimonies and project presentations**, we will be able to get to know some of the educational entities, congregations and Church organizations with which the Society interacts and some intercultural and leadership projects in which several sisters have participated.

≈ For each topic the video/s and a guide for community/group reflection are provided.

As in section 1A, we suggest the two themes that we consider basic for the elaboration of the contributions. *In this case, we encourage all the communities to dedicate two sessions to the experiences of the older sisters* and to *formation in synodal and intercultural leadership.*

- → To complete the option for the elaboration of contributions, we suggest one more experience be chosen according to the preferences of the community or group. In other words, the work proposal for all the communities is as follows:
 - 1. Our Older sisters. Listening to life given
 - 2. Synodal and intercultural leadership. Listening to life in order to serve
 - 3. Another topic to be chosen by the group/community.
- → Option to continue deepening: once the contributions to the Chapter have been sent, we encourage you to continue with the reflection on the Chapter theme using the rest of the materials of this section 1B that have not been worked on in the previous stage.
- → Option to work in groups on specific topics of interest, either to go deeper or to send contributions: All the videos and guides for reflection from the experiences will be available for groups who wish to use them, according to their interests or formation needs throughout the chapter year.

2. HOW MANY LOAVES OF BREAD DO YOU HAVE?... They all ate and were satisfied.

"Give them some food yourselves." But they said to him,

"Are we to buy two hundred days' wages worth of food and give it to them to eat?"

He asked them.

Based on what we experienced and shared in the previous section, and after reflection, in this second part we invite ourselves to ask: how many loaves of bread do we have? How can we multiply them by sharing and recreating what we are and what we have with others?

In this second part of our journey of reflection we propose several moments for personal and community discernment that will lead us to the elaboration of the contributions for the provincial chapters.

The Spirit, together with our teachers Henry and Teresa, have accompanied us on this journey, and now they invite us to stop again and listen more deeply to their voice in the here and now of our reality and of the Society.

2A. "How many loaves do you have? Go and see.

In section 2A, through a **prayerful reading of Teresa** and **a retreat, we** are invited to look at the journey we have made up to this moment, to gather what has been happening in each of us personally and as a community, and to ask ourselves about the invitations that the Spirit has been awakening in us.
